As part of an overall effort by federal, state and local agencies to redevelop and improve our nation's parks, this grant will help renovate Southside Park's group picnic area and contribute to the city's master plan to redevelop the park.

Located at 2115 6th Street, Southside Park encompasses 19.9 acres and offers basketball courts, tennis courts, a swimming pool, two children's play area, a community center, a .75 mile jogging and fitness course, and seven picnic areas.
