WASHINGTON, DC – Earlier today, the House of Representatives considered H.R. 787, a bill to designate Sacramento's federal courthouse at 501 I Street the "Robert T. Matsui United States Courthouse." The bill passed unanimously, 426 to 0. Prior to passage, Rep. Matsui made the following remarks on the House floor:
